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

## FROM THE DESK OF YOUR VILLAGE PRESIDENT

Last month, I attended the Turnout for Transportation meeting at the Marathon County Courthouse. The meeting focused on critical street projects in our region and the need for the state to find a sustainable solution for funding our local roads and state highways.

This event was organized by the Transportation Development Association (TDA) of Wisconsin, which is a statewide alliance of 400-plus stakeholders committed to advancing the best in transportation. TDA members include businesses, labor unions, citizen groups, government units, and individuals. All members share one important goal: the development and maintenance of a strong, interconnected transportation network that will support a robust economy and enhance the quality of life for everyone in Wisconsin. **Local officials, like me, gathered at Turnout for Transportation to have their voices heard in a simultaneous meeting to bring attention to the issue of sustainable transportation.** This meeting was an unprecedented statewide town-hall discussion, with county, city, village, and town officials from all 72 Wisconsin counties participating.

Many of our local roads here in the Village of Weston have been maintained well. Every two years, our staff rates our roads on a 1-10 scale where 10 is a brand new road and a 1 is failed road in need of reconstruction. The village has 117 centerline miles of road and currently nearly 93 miles (80%) are rated 6 or higher. Keeping good roads in good condition is a priority of the Village. **If we don't properly fund maintenance for those roughly 93 miles of roads that have PASER ratings of between 6 and 10, the cost of capital improvements is going to go up, as once roads reach a rating of about a 5, light maintenance is no longer a viable option and complete reconstruction is usually the best option.**

Village officials and staff are currently working on the budget for next year. As such, I have asked that Village staff make an extra effort to prioritize more resources for street maintenance and repair. I realize this is a difficult ask, as the Village has many services and facilities that are also deserving of additional funding. To complicate matters, the Village has lost almost \$7 million in state aids and shared revenues. **Preliminary calculations presented by Village staff show that we are currently underfunding our street-maintenance budget by \$1 million annually.**

Adequately funding street-maintenance programs is not just a challenge for Weston. It's an issue being discussed in communities throughout our state. Unfortunately, there are no "silver bullets" to address these funding challenges: Marshfield held a public referendum in August, and Wausau will hold one in November, exclusively on the topic of street funding. Marathon County has chosen to implement a wheel tax next fiscal year.

As the Trustees and I continue to discuss and debate these issues, we will continue to market Weston for economic development. We realize new projects and more tax base will provide additional resources for Weston, which would help us address funding challenges in the future. ## A WORD FROM YOUR ADMINISTRATOR

While I was a graduate student in public administration, Government Budgeting and Public Finance was a required class. It was an intimidating class for many, as the responsibility to budget and manage tens of millions of dollars can be scary for new practitioners of municipal management. My

instructor tried to make the class as interesting as possible and was known for his witticisms and memorable anecdotes. My favorite quote from his class was as follows:

***"Budgeting in the public sector is usually 9 months of amnesia and 3 months of panic."***

Throughout my career as a municipal manager, I have certainly worked for local government agencies where that mantra was an accurate depiction of the culture of the organization. However, memorable quotes like this have impressed upon me the importance of 1) building a strong strategic plan for your local government, 2) having a financial plan that goes out at least 5 years into the future, 3) proactive planning (rather than reactive responses), and 4) continuing to communicate those plans to our citizens and taxpayers.

As I prepare my budget proposal for 2017, I'm happy to report that there are many positive things happening within our local government agency:

- **The Village has the lowest tax rate in the metro area for a full-service, incorporated municipality.**
- We continue to aggressively pay down our debts. (We have less general obligation debt today than the Village has ever had.)
- We have strong prospects for economic development, which will generate more tax base and bring in new revenues and provide the community with increased opportunities for commerce and employment.

Some things that you can continue to expect from our budgeting decisions going forward include:

- Our financial plans are based on a 1% growth in valuation for the community, annually.
- **Our financial plans are based on losing approximately \$150,000/year in state aids and shared revenues.**
- Our financial plans are based on an annual tax increase of 3.44%.

Some areas that I am focusing on for the 2017 budget include:

- I have asked our Director team to make a strong effort toward multi-year planning and forecasting; the Village is in the process of completing its 3-year effort to update the community's Comprehensive Plan.
- **We continue to make plans for new and improved public spaces, parks, and recreation facilities, which we will grant-write and fundraise for.**
- We are trying to emphasize capital projects, fleet replacement, and facility improvements.
- We will continue to make investments in economic development.


### PHOTO ID REQUIRED TO VOTE

## VEHICLE PARKING

**REMINDER: All motor vehicles parked outside—including vehicles that are for sale—must be parked on an all-weather surface** such as blacktop, concrete, or paving blocks (a gravel surface is acceptable if it was permitted before January 1, 2014). Inoperable or unlicensed vehicles need to be parked in a garage. **Campers, boats, and trailers may be parked on the lawn next to your garage or driveway as long as the yard is maintained so it's free of tall grass and weeds.** Also, no more than 2 recreational vehicles (including trailers) are allowed to be parked on a property zoned residential. Failure to comply may result in the issuance of a citation from the Everest Metro Police.

## TAX PAYMENTS

The 2016 Tax bills are scheduled to be sent out mid December. Payments will continue to be taken at the Weston Municipal Center (cash or check only) and most local banks.

# GARBAGE/RECYCLING

## GARBAGE & RECYCLING CONTAINERS



Please place garbage and recycling containers behind the **curb** (behind the shoulder) on the day of the scheduled pickup. Containers placed in the roadway or sticking too far out at the end of the driveway are more likely to be damaged or knocked over by snowplows. Snowplow drivers are instructed not to cross the centerline of the street as a safety precaution.

If you are unable to place your containers on opposite sides of your driveway, please be sure to keep at least 4 feet of space between the two (and your mailbox).

# PUBLIC WORKS & UTILITIES

## WINTER IS APPROACHING

Please read these helpful reminders as we head into the winter season.

### STREET SNOW-PLOWING PRIORITIES

The Public Works Department is responsible for maintaining nearly 300 lane miles of streets in the Village and Town of Weston.

During a snow event, to ensure that citizens are only a few blocks from a plowed street, snow-plowing priorities have been established such that **the following major streets in Weston are snow-plowed first:**

- Alderson St.
- Fuller St.
- Jelinek Ave.
- Ross Ave.
- Schofield Ave.
- Weston Ave.
- Business 51 (plowed by Marathon County)
- Camp Phillips Rd. (plowed by Marathon County)
- Other streets highlighted on the map (these receive first priority as main thoroughfares)

### KEEP SNOW ON YOUR PROPERTY FOR ROADWAY SAFETY

**Do not blow, plow, or shovel snow onto or across public roadways.**

This creates a safety hazard and is a violation of state statutes and Village ordinance. (Sec. 86.022 Stats and Sec. 70.104 Weston Municipal Code).

### SNOW EMERGENCY

If a large storm is coming, the Village may declare a snow emergency via local television, radio, and news outlets.

**During a declared snow emergency, vehicles need to be off the roads for 24 hours.**

### GIVE PLOWS ROOM TO MANUEVER

It is important to **stay at least 200 feet behind a snowplow.** These vehicles make frequent backing maneuvers, primarily at intersections, and can't easily see behind them.

### WINTER PARKING REGULATIONS

**From October 31 to May 1, alternate side parking is in effect for all streets in the Village of Weston between 4:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.** During this time, vehicles shall be parked on the even-numbered side of the street on even-numbered calendar days, and on the odd side of the street on odd-numbered calendar days, unless otherwise posted or exempted.

For example, if your address is 5500 (an even number), you may park on your side of the street between 4 a.m. and 4 p.m. on the 2nd, 4th, 6th, etc., of the month, and you would have to park across the street on the 1st, 3rd, 5th, etc., on the alternate days. (Remember: If parking a car on the street overnight, it's what the date will be at 4:00 a.m. the following day that determines which side to park on.)

Alternate side parking helps ensure plow trucks can properly plow streets, as vehicles will be on only one side of the road when they come through. In the past, plow trucks had to skip streets due to parked vehicles being on both sides of the road, not leaving enough room for the plow to drive between the parked vehicles.



## PREVENT HOME WATER-LINE FREEZE-UPS

It's important for property owners and tenants to assess areas where their interior or exterior plumbing may be exposed to the cold. The Village suggests that before winter comes, you:

- Check basements and crawlspaces to make sure all windows are closed and that any exposed water piping is not subject to cold drafts, particularly your water meter.
- Make sure piping on the interior side of an exterior wall isn't insulated from the interior heat (such as under a kitchen cabinet).
- Insulate any exposed piping in areas that are not heated.
- Know where your water lateral is located between your home and the street. If possible, do not remove snow from the ground above the lateral.

## SIDEWALK SNOW-REMOVAL POLICY

Property owners are responsible for snow removal from sidewalks within 48 hours after snow fall ceases. Failure to remove snow/ice within 48 hours may result in the Village having to clear the sidewalk at the expense of the property owner.



## MAILBOX PLACEMENT


Before the first snowfall, check the condition of your mailbox post and the placement of your mailbox in relation to the roadway.

- The Village will assist in repairing mailboxes **ONLY** if the mailbox and/or post is physically struck by the plow itself.
- The Village is **NOT** responsible for damage caused by plowed snow hitting the mailbox or frozen snow/ice moved during plowing operations.

## MAILBOX SNOW CLEARING

It is the responsibility of residents to clear the snow away from their mailbox. The snowplows will get as close to mailboxes as possible, but will not be able to clear all of the snow.



## RIGHT-OF-WAY OBSTRUCTIONS

The area of land between the edge of pavement and the private property line is referred to as the **road right-of-way** and is public property. The road right-of-way typically extends 33 feet from the center of the road.


During winter operations, the Village will occasionally remove snow from the side of the road and at driveway openings to provide better visibility. As the Village is clearing the right-of-way, many items become buried in the snow and are difficult to see. As such, **the following items should not be located within the public right-of-way:**

- Landscaping materials (shrubs, rocks, boulders, planters, decorative pieces)
- Signs
- Lawn sprinkler systems
- Pet fences
- All other items that could be damaged by equipment

Any items that are placed within the right-of-way are there at the risk of the owner. The Village is not responsible for any damage to these items.

- Additional information regarding yard-waste pickup (NOTE: Weston Street Operations will be stopping at each residence two times this fall for yard-waste removal. The web-mapping application displays the two dates the crew plans on visiting your property.)
- A direct link with a **Google Map location of your voting location**

- Increased interactivity when clicking to learn about a parcel experience
