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ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Sec. 82.101. Other laws adopted.

There is adopted by reference the following section of the Wisconsin Statutes, but the prosecution of such offenses under this article shall be as provided in Wis. Stats. Chapters <u>340</u> through <u>348</u>; and the penalty for violation shall be limited to a forfeiture as provided in Sec. 82.102:

Sec. 82.102. Penalty.

- (a) *Forfeiture*. The penalty for violation of any provision of this article shall be a forfeiture.
- (b) *Uniform offenses*. Forfeitures for violation of any provision of Wis. Stats. Chapters 340 through 348, adopted by reference, shall conform to forfeitures for violation of the comparable state offenses, including any variations or increases for second offenses.
- (c) *Special local regulations*. The forfeiture for violation of local village regulations shall not be less than \$5.00 nor more than \$200.00 for the first offense and not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$500.00 for the second offense within two years.
- (d) *Miscellaneous*. The forfeiture for violation of any provision of this chapter not otherwise specified shall be not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$500.00.

Sec. 82.103. Traffic violation and registration program.

- (a) *Purpose*. In order to discourage nonmoving traffic violations and to encourage the payment of forfeitures imposed for such violations, the board deems it advisable to participate in the state traffic violation and registration program.
- (b) Nonmoving violations and registration program. Pursuant to the provisions of Wis. Stat. § 345.28(4) and Wis. Admin. Code TRANS Chapter 128, the village elects to participate in the nonmoving traffic violation registration program of the department of transportation and pay the costs established by the department under Wis. Stat. § 85.13; such costs shall, in turn, be assessed against persons charged with nonmoving traffic violations. The Everest Metro Police Department shall be responsible for complying with the requirements set forth in Wis. Stat. § 345.28(4).
- (c) *Forfeiture for certain stipulated nonmoving traffic violations*. The forfeiture upon stipulation for the violations of Wis. Stats. §§ 346.503 through 346.55, incorporated into this article by reference, and for violations of Sec. 82.107 shall be in the sum of \$10.00.
- (d) **Payment and increased forfeiture**. If a stipulation is not entered into within five days commencing at 6:00 p.m. on the day the citation is issued, the forfeiture shall be increased to conform to the forfeitures for a violation of the comparable state offenses, including any variations or increases for second offenses.
- (e) Stipulation deposit.
 - (1) The amount of the forfeiture for such violations shall be paid in cash, money order, bank check or by other means acceptable to the police department. It shall be made payable to the village. Such payment may be made by mail as provided on the citation. If the person receiving the citation transmits the citation by messenger or mail to the police station, the police department may require such person to print his name, post office address, his operator's license number and date of birth on the citation as appropriate.
 - (2) No officer or village authority shall be personally or officially responsible for payment of any dishonored check in payment of any forfeiture.
- (f) *Failure to pay forfeiture*. The provisions of Wis. Stat. § 345.28 are specifically incorporated in this section by reference. If the alleged violator fails to pay the amount of the forfeiture or to appear in court within 28 days after the issuance of a nonmoving traffic citation, the village may take any of the actions authorized under Wis. Stat. § 345.28 with respect to the violation.

Sec. 82.104. Enforcement.

- (a) *Authority*. This article shall be enforced in accordance with the provisions of Wis. Stats. §§ 345.20 through 345.53, Wis. Stats. Chapter 799, and Wis. Stat. § 66.0113.
- (b) Stipulation of guilt or no contest. Stipulations of guilt or no contest may be made by persons arrested for violations of this article in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 66.0114(1)(b) whenever the provisions of Wis. Stat. § 345.27 are inapplicable to such violations. Stipulations shall conform to the form contained on the uniform traffic citation and complaint under Wis. Stat. § 345.11 and may be accepted within five days of the date of the alleged violation. Stipulations may be accepted by the police department.
- (c) **Deposits**. Any person stipulating guilt or no contest under subsection (b) of this section must make the deposit required under Wis. Stat. § 345.26 or if the deposit is not established under such statute, shall deposit a forfeited penalty as provided in the schedule established by the chief of police and approved by the board. Deposits may be brought or mailed to the office of the police department or as directed by the arresting officer. Deposits for parking or nonmoving violations shall be mailed or brought to the village clerk/treasurer or to the police department.
- (d) Notice of demerit points and receipt. Every officer accepting a forfeited penalty or money deposit under this section shall receipt in triplicate as provided in Wis. Stat. § 345.26(3)(b). Every officer accepting a stipulation under the provisions of this section shall comply with the provisions of Wis. Stats. §§ 345.26(1)(a) and 345.27(2) and shall require the alleged violator to sign a statement of notice in substantially the form contained on the uniform traffic citation and complaint promulgated under Wis. Stat. § 345.11.

Sec. 82.105. Traffic devices ratified.

All traffic control signs, signals, devices and markings in place on the date of adoption of this Code are expressly ratified and confirmed.

Sec. 82.106 Official traffic signs and signals.

(a) *Erection of official traffic signs and signals*. The operations manager is authorized and directed to procure, erect and maintain appropriate standard traffic signs, signals and markings conforming to the rules of the state highway division, giving such notice of the provisions of this section as required by law. Signs shall be erected in

- such locations and manner as the board shall determine will best effect the purposes of this section and give adequate warning to users of the street or highway.
- (b) **Removal of official signs and signals**. The operations manager shall have the authority granted by Wis. Stat. § 349.09 and is directed to order the removal of a sign, signal, marking or device placed, maintained or displayed in violation of Wis. Stat. § 346.41. Any charge imposed on a premises for removal of such illegal sign, signal or device shall be reported to the board at its next regular meeting for review and certification.
- (c) *Yield right-of-way*. The village board may, by ordinance or resolution, provide for the installation of yield signs at any intersection over which it has exclusive jurisdiction, but if the intersection is part of a thru highway, such yield signs can be installed at such intersections only as provided in Wis. Stat. § 349.07(6)(a). The design, installation and use of such signs shall be in accordance with the rules of the state highway commission.
- (d) *Speed limits*. The village board, by resolution, shall from time to time set speed limits on village streets. Such limits shall be listed in the manual of traffic speed zoning.

Sec. 82.107. Parking regulations.

- (a) Winter parking regulated. When signs have been erected at or reasonably near the village limits as provided in Wis. Stat. § 349.13, alternate side parking shall be in effect on all streets between the hours of 4:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. of any day from October 31 to May 1. All vehicles shall be parked only on the even-numbered side of the street on even-numbered calendar days, and only on the odd side of the street on odd-numbered calendar days, unless otherwise posted or exempted. No person shall park, stop, or leave standing any vehicle in violation of this subsection.
- (b) *Official signs*. No person shall park, stop or leave standing any vehicle on any public street or alley in the village when or where official signs have been erected or displayed prohibiting or limiting parking at such place, except in conformity with such official signs.
- (c) **Snow removal emergency**. When circumstances warrant, the village may declare a snow removal emergency and specify its duration, during which emergency the street shall be cleared for the purpose of permitting the official removal of snow and ice; provided that:
 - (1) Notice of such declaration shall be given by either the president or the director of public works and the police chief or by broadcast or telecast over a radio or television station located in the Wausau, Wisconsin, area.

- (2) After notice is given, during the period of such snow removal emergency as so declared, no vehicle shall be parked, stopped or left standing on any public street or alley within the village.
- (3) If any vehicle shall be found standing, stopped or parked upon any public street or alley within the village during the period of a snow removal emergency, the chief of police may cause such vehicle to be towed away. The owner of such vehicle shall not be entitled to recover possession of such vehicle until an expense and tow charge as set by board resolution is paid to the village clerk/treasurer or chief of police and his receipt exhibited. All charges for towing and storage shall be in addition to all other penalties imposed by law or ordinance.

Sec. 82.108. Accident reports.

The operator of any vehicle involved in an accident shall within 24 hours after such accident file with the police department a copy of the report required by Wis. Stat. § 346.70. If the operator is unable to make such report, any occupant of the vehicle at the time of the accident, capable of making such report, shall have the duty to comply with this section. Such reports shall be subject to the provisions and limitations in Wis. Stats. §§ 346.70(4)(f) and 346.73.

Sec. 82.109. Traffic and parking regulations on school grounds.

- (a) *Authority*. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § <u>118.105</u>, the provisions of this section shall apply on all school property, public and parochial located in the village.
- (b) *Parking*. No person shall park any vehicle in any vehicular traveling area or parking areas of the D.C. Everest School District or parochial school district, except in conformity with the posted parking regulations set forth for such vehicular travel and parking areas.
- (c) *Speed limits*. No person shall, at any time, operate a motor vehicle upon any D.C. Everest School District or parochial school district grounds at a speed in excess of any posted speed limit, or lacking any specific speed limit posting at a speed greater than ten miles per hour.

- (d) **Vehicles prohibited at specified times**. No person shall, at any time, operate a motor vehicle other than a school bus or emergency vehicle, in or upon any drive designated for buses only, during the hours indicated by posted signs on weekdays during the months when school is in session.
- (e) *Parking lot dividers and islands*. No person shall operate a motor vehicle on such premises across parking lot islands or parking lot dividers.
- (f) *Applicability of other sections*. Secs. 82.100, 82.101, 82.106, 82.107, 82.108, 82.112, 82.119, 82.121, and 82.122 shall also apply to this section.
- (g) Section references in subsection (f) of this section to apply on public and parochial school property. All sections referred to in subsection (f) of this section are amended in accordance with Wis. Stat. § <u>118.105</u> and apply on all school property, public and parochial located in the village.
- (h) *Applicability of state law*. Any changes, additions or deletions in Wis. Stat. § <u>118.105</u> and Wis. Stats. Chapters <u>23</u>, <u>28</u>, <u>343</u> through <u>348</u> and <u>350</u> shall be applied to this section.

Sec. 82.110. Railroad grade crossing stops.

Pursuant to the authority granted in Wis. Stat. § 349.085, operators of vehicles shall be required to stop at all railroad grade crossings within the village at which there has been installed an official stop sign of the size and type prescribed in Wis. Stat. § 349.065.

Sec. 82.111. Regulation of nondealership motor vehicle sales.

- (a) Sale of motor vehicles on unowned property prohibited. No person shall sell, advertise or display a motor vehicle for sale on any property unless the person owns the property on which the motor vehicle is sold, displayed or advertised.
- (b) *Exceptions*. This section shall not apply to a person licensed by the state as a motor vehicle dealer at the property's address and who occupies the property pursuant to a written lease.
- (c) Abandoned vehicles. Any motor vehicle left unattended without permission of the property owner for more than 48 hours, which is not titled in the owner of the

- property as shown by public records or as may be determined by other reasonable means, shall be deemed abandoned and dealt with as provided in Wis. Stat. § 342.40.
- (d) *Penalty*. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall upon conviction be subject to Sec. 1.111.

Sec. 82.112. Truck idling near a school or residence.

- (a) Purpose and authority.
 - (1) The purpose of this ordinance is to protect the public health of the citizens of the Village of Weston and the environment by reducing emissions from diesel powered motor vehicles. This section is enacted under the authority of Wis. Stat. § 66.0101.
- (b) Definitions. The following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.
 - (1) "Commercial motor vehicle" means any vehicle or combination of vehicles as defined in Wis. Stats. <u>Chapter 340</u> and any other motor truck with a gross vehicle weight rating of ten thousand one pounds or more, except for either a zero-emission vehicle or a pickup truck as defined in Wis. Stats. <u>Chapter 340</u>.
 - (2) "Driver" means any person who drives, operates, or is in actual physical control of a vehicle.
 - (3) "Emergency" means sudden, urgent, usually unforeseen occurrence.
 - (4) "Gross vehicle weight rating" means the weight specified by the manufacturer as the maximum loaded weight of a single vehicle.
 - (5) "Idling" means the engine is running while the vehicle is stationary.
 - (6) "Official traffic control device" means any sign, signal, marking or device, consistent with Wis. Stats. <u>Chapter 340</u>, placed or erected by authority of a public body or official having jurisdiction, for the purpose of regulating, warning, or guiding traffic, but does not include islands, curbs, traffic barriers, speed humps, speed bumps or other roadway design features.
 - (7) "Official traffic control signal" means any device, whether manually, electrically, or mechanically operated, by which traffic is alternately directed to stop and proceed and which is erected by authority of a public body or official having jurisdiction.

- (8) "Vehicle" means any on-road, self-propelled vehicle that is required to be registered and have a license plate by the Department of Motor Vehicles.
- (9) "Vehicle/equipment owner" means the registered owner, lessee, licensee or bailee of any heavy- or medium-duty vehicle who operates or directs the operation of any such vehicle on either a for hire or not for hire basis.
- (c) Applicability. This chapter applies to the operation of diesel powered commercial motor vehicles as defined by Wis. Stat. § 340.01(8).
- (d) Excessive idling prohibited. No person responsible for the operation of a diesel powered commercial vehicle shall allow or cause the vehicle to idle with the motor running in the Village for more than five (5) minutes in a sixty (60) minute period.
- (e) Exceptions.
 - (1) This Chapter does not apply to a vehicle for the period or periods during which:
 - a. Idling is necessary while stopped:
 - 1. For an official traffic control device,
 - 2. For an official traffic control signal,
 - 3. For traffic conditions over which the driver has no control, including, but not limited to, stopped in a line of traffic, stopped at a railroad crossing, or stopped at a construction zone, or
 - 4. At the direction of a peace officer;
 - b. Idling is necessary to ascertain that the vehicle is in safe operating condition, equipped as required by all provisions of law, and all equipment is in good working order, either as part of the daily vehicle inspection or as otherwise needed, provided that such engine idling is mandatory for such verification;
 - c. Idling is necessary for testing, servicing, repairing or diagnostic purposes;
 - d. Idling is necessary for a period not to exceed three to five minutes (as per the recommendation of the manufacturer) to cool down a turbo charged heavy-duty vehicle before turning the engine off;
 - e. Idling is necessary to accomplish work for which the vehicle/equipment was designed, other than transporting goods, such as operating a lift, crane, pump, drill, hoist, mixer or other auxiliary equipment other than a heater or air conditioner;

- f. Idling is necessary to operate a lift or other piece of equipment designed to ensure safe loading and unloading of goods and people;
- g. Idling is necessary to operate defrosters, heaters, air conditioners, or other equipment to prevent a safety or health emergency, but not solely for the comfort of the driver or passengers.
 - 1. The only exception for driver comfort would be a vehicle driver that is required to have rest time by law. In this case, the driver may only idle at a designated rest area or truck stop and will not idle within one thousand feet of a residential area or school,
 - 2. The only specific exception for passenger comfort would be vehicles with a passenger onboard with a disability or health condition that would be critically aggravated if the vehicle were not maintained at an adequate temperature,
 - 3. In the event idling is necessary to operate defrosters, heaters, air conditioners, or other equipment to prevent a safety or health emergency, but not solely for the comfort of the driver or passengers, such idling shall not occur within one hundred feet of a residence or a school;
- h. Idling is necessary solely to recharge a battery or other energy storage unit of a hybrid electric vehicle/equipment;
- i. Idling is necessary to operate equipment that runs intermittently;
- j. A passenger bus idles a maximum of 15 minutes in any 60-minute period to maintain passenger comfort while non-driver passengers are on board;
- k. Off-road equipment or transit buses are in immediate stand-by mode for passenger loading/unloading, project and/or worker safety, for readiness of an upcoming phase of a specific project element, or is needed for a stopand-go project element.
- 1. An armored vehicle idles when a person remains inside the vehicle to guard the contents or the vehicle is being loaded or unloaded.
- (2) Nothing in this chapter allows idling in excess of other applicable laws, including but not limited to:
 - a. Wis. Stats. <u>Chapter 342</u> Requirements for leaving a motor vehicle unattended.

- b. Any local provision of this code or requirement as stringent as, or more stringent than, this Chapter.
- (f) Penalties. Any person who violates this section shall be subject to the penalty provision of Sec. 1.111.

ARTICLE II SNOWMOBILES

Sec. 82.200. Provisions of state law relating to snowmobiles adopted by reference.

- (a) Except as otherwise specifically provided in this section, all provisions of Wis. Stats. Chapter 350 describing and defining regulations with respect to snowmobiles for which the penalty is a forfeiture only, including penalties to be imposed and procedure for prosecution, are adopted and by reference made a part of this section as if fully set forth. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute incorporated by reference is required or prohibited by this section.

Sec. 82.201. Snowmobile routes.

- (1) *General regulations*. Except as provided in Wis. Stats. §§ 350.02 and 350.045, or for snowmobile events authorized in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 350.04, no person shall operate a snowmobile upon any public right-of-way, in any public park or on any other property in the Village of Weston except upon snowmobile routes, trails and areas designated by the village board.
- (2) Designated snowmobile trails, roads and/or highways.
 - (a) Snowmobile trails. Snowmobile operation within the Village of Weston is permitted upon routes and trails designated as "snowmobile trails" on a map entitled "Snowmobile Access Corridor--10 mph Village and Town of Weston, Marathon County, Wisconsin" dated October 12, 2001, prepared by the Village of Weston Engineering Department, a copy of which is on file in the office of the village clerk.
 - (b) *Village street and highway access routes*. There is hereby established by the village board a snowmobile "access buffer zone" as shown and depicted on the

map described in subsection 2(a) of this section. Except for the non-access roadways shown on the said map, snowmobile operation at speeds not exceeding ten miles per hour shall be permitted upon those village streets and roadways, and shoulders thereof, which are located within the "access buffer zone" solely as a means of providing access for persons traveling by snowmobile from a residence within the limits of the buffer zone to the nearest snowmobile trail or route closest to that residence. Any operation of a snowmobile on any road or street other than for immediate access to a snowmobile trail or route within the access buffer zone is prohibited.

- (3) **Penalty**. Any person who violates any provision of this section shall upon conviction thereof, be subject to the following forfeitures and costs.
 - (a) For a first or second violation, a forfeiture of not more than \$250.00 for each offense.
 - (b) For any person who violates any provision of this section who, within the last three years prior to the conviction for the current violation, was two or more times previously convicted for violating the same provision of this ordinance, a forfeiture of not more than \$500.00.
 - (c) In addition to the foregoing forfeitures a person convicted shall be subject to costs of prosecution and in default of payment of said forfeitures and/or costs of prosecution, imprisonment in the Marathon County Jail for a period not to exceed 90 days or until such forfeiture and costs are paid.

ARTICLE III. BICYCLES

Sec. 82.300. Definitions.

In this article, the following words and phrases have the designated meanings unless a different meaning is expressly provided or the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

- (a) "Bicycle" means every vehicle propelled by feet or hands acting upon pedals or cranks and having wheels any two of which are not less than fourteen inches (14") in diameter.
- (b) "Bicycle Lane" means that portion of a roadway set aside by the Village for the exclusive use of bicycles, electric personal assistive mobility devices, or pedestrians on foot or using rollerblades, and so designated by appropriate signs and markings.

- (c) "Bike Route" means any bicycle lane, bicycle way or highway which has been duly designated by the responsible governing body and identified by appropriate signs and markings.
- (d) "Bicycle Way" means any path or sidewalk or portion thereof designated for the use of bicycles and electric personal assistive mobility devices by the responsible governing body.
- (e) "Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device" means a self-balancing, two-nontandem-wheeled device that is designed to transport only one person and that has an electric propulsion system that limits the maximum speed of the device to 15 mph or less.

Sec. 82.301. Penalty.

The penalty provisions of Sec. 1.111 shall apply to any violation of this article.

Sec. 82.302. Registration required.

- (a) No person shall operate a bicycle upon any street, alley, public highway, sidewalk, bicycle lane, bicycle route, bicycle way or other public right-of-way in the village unless the bicycle is registered and has affixed a registration plate as provided in this article.
- (b) This article shall apply to all permanent and temporary residents of the village and to such nonresidents who operate bicycles upon the streets of the village habitually or frequently, either in going to or from school, or to and from work, or for other purposes, but shall not apply to casual travelers or tourists passing through the village on their bicycles, nor to those residents of cities, villages and townships adjacent to the village who are validly and currently registered within their respective jurisdictions.

Sec. 82.303. Registration; fee; inspection.

(a) Registration shall be made with the police department, who shall provide the appropriate forms. Upon payment of a registration fee provided in the village fee

- schedule, the police department shall issue a registration plate for the bicycle, which shall permit the bicycle to be operated within the village as provided in this article.
- (b) The registration shall be permanent from the date of issuance provided the bicycle remains with the registered owner and at the registered address. In the event of a sale or other transfer of the bicycle to a new owner, a transfer of registration must be completed in conformity with the provisions of Sec. 82.117.
- (c) No person shall be entitled to register a bicycle when that person is believed by the Everest Metro Police Department to have no claim to, or evidence of, ownership of the bicycle or have no right to possession of such bicycle.
- (d) The Everest Metro Police Department may inspect each bicycle before registering it, and the department may refuse to register any bicycle that the registering officer believes to be in an unsafe mechanical condition.

Sec. 82.304. Display of registration plate.

- (a) No bicycle shall be considered registered until a registration plate, which shall remain legible at all times is affixed to the bicycle, which shall remain so affixed until the bicycle is either dismantled, destroyed or removed by the Everest Metro Police Department for cause. Such license shall be attached securely to the rear of the operator's seat or to the rear fender of the bicycle.
- (b) No person shall intentionally destroy, mutilate or alter the identification plate affixed to any bicycle or remove, without the permission of the owner, any identification plate from any bicycle. If a replacement plate must be issued, the fee shall be as provided in the village fee schedule.

Sec. 82.305. Transfer and cancellation of registration.

Within ten days after any bicycle registered under this article changes ownership, is transferred or dismantled and/or taken out of operation, the person in whose name the bicycle has been registered shall report such information to the Everest Metro Police Department. In the event of a change of ownership or other transfer of the bicycle wherein the bicycle remains in use in the village, the license plate will remain with the bicycle. Every such person who transfers the title of any bicycle shall endorse upon the bottom of the registration card the name and address of the transferee, the date of the transfer and the name of the transferor. The transferee shall re-register

the bicycle and shall pay a transfer fee as provided in the village fee schedule. If a bicycle is dismantled and/or taken out of operation, the license plate will not remain with the bicycle but shall be immediately destroyed by the person disposing of or dismantling the bicycle.

Sec. 82.306. Buying or selling bicycles.

Every person engaged in the business of buying, selling or exchanging bicycles in the village shall maintain for three years from the date of the transaction a record containing the brand name, color, type and serial number of each bicycle bought, sold or exchanged and shall record the name and address of each person buying, selling or exchanging a bicycle. This record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Everest Metro Police Department during reasonable business hours.

Sec. 82.307. Bicycle Lanes

- (a) Designation. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §349.23(2), the Village hereby designates those clearly marked portions of Ross Avenue between Cut Off Road and Babl Lane as a Bicycle Lane.
- (b) Permitted Use. The Ross Avenue Bicycle Lane may be used by Bicycles, Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Devices, or pedestrians on foot or using other human propelled devices such as rollerblades.
- (c) Movement. Bicycles and Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Devices shall move within the Bicycle Lane in the same direction as motor vehicle traffic on the roadway next to the Bicycle Lane and pedestrians shall move within the Bicycle Lane in the opposite direction of, or facing motor vehicle and bicycle traffic.

ARTICLE IV. MINIBIKES AND SELF PROPELLED DEVICES

Sec. 82.400. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Highway, means all public ways and thoroughfares and bridges on such ways and thoroughfares. It includes the entire width between the boundary lines of every way open to the use of the public as a matter of right for the purposes of vehicular travel. It includes not only the actual traveled portion of the roadway, but also the shoulders, ditches and other adjacent areas that are owned by or reserved for the use of the public.

Minibike, means any self-propelled device primarily used for transportation or sport, including but not limited to motorcycles, go-carts, motorized bicycles, off-the-road trail bikes, and all-terrain vehicles.

Self-propelled device, means any device designed primarily for off-the-road use which is internal combustion engine driven or electric motor driven, and in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn. It includes without limitation for lack of enumeration, such devices commonly known as minibikes, go-carts and motor bicycles.

Sec. 82.401. Penalty.

The violation of any of the provisions of this article relating to the operation of minibikes or self-propelled devices shall subject the violator to Sec. 1.111.

Sec. 82.402. Operation.

No person shall operate a minibike or self-propelled device in the village in the following manner:

- (1) At a rate of speed that is unreasonable or imprudent under the circumstances.
- (2) In any careless way so as to endanger the person or property of another.
- (3) While under the influence of intoxicating liquor, fermented malt beverages, narcotics or other controlled substances.

- (4) In such a way that the exhaust of the motor makes an excessive or unusual noise.
- (5) Without a functioning muffler.
- (6) Upon any public highway, street or alley, or upon any sidewalk or parkway in the village unless such vehicle is registered as required by Wis. Stats. <u>Chapter 341</u> and its operation and operator are specifically permitted to operate the vehicle by statute.
- (7) Upon any slide, ski or skating area, except for the purpose of serving the area or crossing the places where marked.
- (8) On any lands operated or leased by the village.
- (9) Upon the private property of another without the consent of the owner or lessee. Failure to post private property does not imply consent for use. Any motor-driven craft, minibike or self-propelled device shall, at all times, have the consent of the owner before operation of such craft or vehicle on private lands.
- (10) On or across a cemetery, burial ground, school or church property, without the express consent of the owner.

Sec. 82.403. Liability of parent or guardian.

No parent or guardian of any child under the age of 18 years shall authorize or permit such child to violate any of the provisions of this article. Any child under the age of 18 years who shall operate a minibike or self-propelled device shall be presumed to be operating the vehicle under the authority of a parent or guardian.

ARTICLE V. ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE AND UTILITY TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTES AND OPERATION ON HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF WESTON

Sec. 82.500. Purpose.

(a). The purpose of this ordinance is to establish all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle routes in the Village of Weston and to regulate the operation of all-terrain and utility terrain vehicles in the Village of Weston.

Sec. 82.501. Authority.

(a). The Village Board of the Village of Weston, Marathon County, Wisconsin, has the specific authority to adopt this All-Terrain and Utility Vehicle Ordinance under s. 23.33(8)(b) and (11), Wis. Stats.

Sec. 82.502. Definitions.

- (a). For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following definitions shall be used. Words used in the present tense include the future; the singular number includes the plural number; and the plural number includes the singular number. The words "shall", "will", and "must" are always mandatory. The words "may" and "should" are discretionary terms. The masculine shall include the feminine. Terms not defined in this Section, shall be interpreted based on common usage.
 - 1) All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV): means a commercially designed and manufactured motor-driven device that has a weight, without fluids, of 900 pounds or less, has a width of 50 inches or less, is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator, and travels on 3 or more low-pressure tires or non-pneumatic tires.
 - 2) Village: means the Village of Weston, the Village Board, Board of Trustees, or any other Village of Weston official(s) authorized by the Village Board to act on behalf of the Village of Weston.
 - 3) Utility Terrain Vehicle (UTV): means any of the following:
 - A commercially designed and manufactured motor driven device that does not meet federal motor vehicle safety standards in effect on July 1, 2012, that is not a golf cart, low-speed vehicle, dune buggy mini-truck, or tracked vehicle, that is designed to be used primarily off of a highway, and that has, and was originally manufactured with, all of the following:
 - 1. A weight, without fluids, of 2,000 pounds or less.
 - 2. Four or more low-pressure tires or non-pneumatic tires.
 - 3. A steering wheel.
 - 4. A tail light.
 - 5. A brake light.
 - 6. Two headlights.
 - 7. A width of not more than 65 inches.
 - 8. A system of seat belts, or a similar system, for restraining each occupant of the device in the event of an accident.
 - 9. A system of structural members designed to reduce the likelihood that an occupant would be crushed as the result of a rollover of the device.
 - A commercially designed and manufactured motor driven device to which all of the following applies:
 - 1. It has a weight, without fluids, of more than 900 pounds but not more than 2000 pounds.
 - 2. It has a width of 50 inches or less.
 - 3. It is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator.

4. It travels on 3 or more low-pressure tires or non-pneumatic tires.

Sec. 82.503. Operation of All-Terrain and Utility Vehicles.

(a). Pursuant to s. <u>23.33(4)(d)4</u>., Wis. Stats., except as otherwise provided in s. <u>23.33(4)</u>, Wis. Stats., no person may operate an all-terrain or utility terrain vehicle on any road, freeway or highway in the Village except on roadways that are designated as all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle routes by this ordinance.

Sec. 82.504. Designation of All-Terrain and Utility Terrain Vehicle Routes.

- (a). South on County Road J from the Eau Claire River, to 6606 County Road J and north on County Road J from 6606 County Road J to the Eau Claire River. Legend A on the ATV Ordinance Map.
- (b). West on Schofield Avenue from the boundary line (between Ringle and Weston) to 6606 County Road J and east on Schofield Avenue from 6606 County Road J to the boundary line (between Ringle and Weston). Legend B on the ATV Ordinance Map.
- (c). West on Weston Avenue from the boundary line (between Ringle and Weston) to 10002 Adventure Way and east to the boundary line (between Ringle and Weston) from 10002 Adventure Way. Legend C on the ATV Ordinance Map.

Sec. 82.505. Conditions applicable to All-Terrain and Utility Terrain vehicle routes.

- (a) Pursuant to s. <u>23.33(8)(d)</u>, Wis. Stats, the following restrictions are placed on the use of the Village all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle routes designated by this ordinance:
 - 1. Routes shall be marked with uniform all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle route signs in accordance with s. NR 64.12(7), Wisconsin Administrative Code. No person may do any of the following in regard to signs marking Village all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle routes unless authorized to do so:
 - 2. Intentionally remove, damage, deface, move, or obstruct any uniform all-terrain and utility vehicle route or trail sign or standard or intentionally interfere with the effective operation of any uniform all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle route or trail sign or standards if the sign or standard is legally placed by the State, any municipality, or any authorized individual.
 - 3. Possess any uniform all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle route or trail sign or standard of the type established by the department for the warning, instruction, or information of the public, unless he or she obtained the uniform all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle route or trail sign or standard in a lawful manner. Possession of a uniform all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle route or trail sign or standard creates a rebuttable presumption of illegal possession.

- (b) Operation shall be subject to all provisions of s. <u>23.33</u>, Wis. Stats., which is adopted as a part of this ordinance by reference, pursuant to s. <u>23.33</u>(11), Wis. Stats.
- (c) Operators must abide by all traffic laws unless further restricted by this Ordinance.
- (d) The speed limit for ATVs and UTVs shall be established at not greater than 35 (thirty-five) miles per hour or the speed limit for automobiles, whichever is lower, on all segments of Village roads designated as ATV route.
- (e) ATVs/UTVs may be operated on paved surfaces only, unless yielding the right of way.
- (f) All all-terrain and utility vehicle operators shall ride single file.
- (g) No ATV/UTV may be operated on any designated route without fully functional headlights, tail-lights and brake lights.
- (h) No ATV/UTV may be operated on any designated route between the hours of 11:59 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. daily, unless a different restriction on hours of operation has been specified by the Village and notice of the same is duly posted on the segment.
- (i) All ATV/UTV operators shall ride on the right-hand side of the paved portion of the highway, unless making a left turn. Operation on the gravel shoulders, grassy in-slope, ditches, or other highway right-of-way is prohibited, unless yielding right of way.
- (j) No ATV/UTV may be operated on any designated ATV route if the ATV/UTV does not meet all applicable Federal noise and air pollution standards.
- (k) No person under the age of sixteen (16) may operate an ATV/UTV on any segment of Village Road which is a designated ATV route.
- (l) No person under the age of eighteen (18) may operate an ATV/UTV on any designated route unless wearing approved protective head gear.
- (m)Every person who operates an ATV/UTV on a segment of Village road which is designated as an ATV route shall have in his or her immediate possession a valid motor vehicle operator's license, and shall display the license document upon demand from any law enforcement officer or official described in Wis. Stat. Section 23.33(12).

Sec. 82.506. Enforcement.

(a). This ordinance may be enforced by any law enforcement officer authorized to enforce the laws of the state of Wisconsin. A copy of this ordinance shall be sent by the Village Clerk, Everest Metro Police Department, the Department of Natural Resources, the Marathon County Sheriff's Department and any other law enforcement agency serving the Village of Weston's jurisdiction.

Sec. 82.507. Penalties.

(a). The penalties under s. 23.33(13)(a), Wis Stats., are adopted by reference.

Sec. 82.508. Maintenance.

(a). Designation of segments of the Village road system as ATV/UTV routes does not impose upon the Village a greater duty of care or responsibility for maintenance of those segments than for any other segment of Village road. Operators of ATV/UTV's on Village roads assume all the usual and normal risks of ATV/UTV operation.

ARTICLE VI. SPEED LIMITS

Sec. 82.600. Speed Limits.
