## STREET AND UTILITY PROJECTS FOR 2023

The Village of Weston has a Capital Improvement Plan which includes facilities, streets and utility projects as well as major equipment purchases. The 2024 projects include the following:

### Street Projects:

- o **East Jelinek Ave and Von Kanel St.** This project is currently in design to reconstruct East Jelinek Ave from Camp Phillips Rd to Mesker St and then Von Kanel St from Schofield Ave to Barbican Ave. The project will include a complete street reconstruction, replacement of existing water and sewer lines and provide new pedestrian accommodations along the corridor.
- o **Jelinek Ave. between the DC Everest Junior High and Senior High.** This is scheduled to be repaved in 2024. This project will include replacement of existing inlets and improvements to curb ramps along with a new asphalt surface.
- o **Schofield Ave and Mesker St. Intersection.** This is being designed for traffic signals to be installed in 2024. As part of the Schofield Ave corridor study this intersection was analyzed for improvements and adding signals here will improve turning and crossing Schofield Ave at Mesker St.
- o **Weston Ave Reconstruction.** Next year 2.25 miles of Weston Avenue will be reconstructed through the Village of Weston.
  - 0.50 miles from Alderson St to Birch St will be reconstructed jointly with the Village of Rothschild in 2024. This project received a grant from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation for \$733,463.03. This project will include a multi-use path along the route as well.
  - 1.75 miles from CR-X to Ryan St is in the final design stage and is planned to be reconstructed in 2024.

### Utility Projects:

- o **Wells 7 and 8 at Yellowbanks Park:** In 2021, the Village received approval from the Public Service Commission (PSC) to construct two new wells and a pumping/treatment works just south of the Disc Golf Course on CR-X/ Camp Phillips Rd. The water quality from the test wells at this site has shown to be better than other existing wells in the Village. These wells will provide the additional capacity the Village needs for the next 20+ years. These wells are scheduled to be completed in September 2023.
- o **PFAS Treatment:** The Village shut down Wells 3 and 4 in 2022 due to elevated levels of PFAS in those two wells. Well 4 had a temporary treatment system installed in fall of 2022 and is pumping water again with no detection of PFAS after treatment. This Spring, the Village Board authorized design for a permanent treatment system for Wells 3 and 4. The Village applied for a Safe Drinking Water Loan from the Department of Natural Resources to help offset the costs. ## WATER UTILITY UPDATES

In July, the Village Board approved an 8.0% increase for water rates starting October 15, 2023. This rate was determined by the Public Service Commission (PSC) of Wisconsin which regulates water utilities in the state. The average residential customer using 12,000 gallons of water per quarter would see their quarterly water bill increase \$4.65. This increase will help the utility to continue improving the water quality for its customers.

Summer is coming to a close and the fall season is beginning. This is the time to prepare for winter by assuring that home furnaces are maintained, filters are replaced, and chimneys are cleaned before the heating season begins. Fire Prevention Week is October 8 – 14 this year and the 2023 theme is “Cooking safety starts with you”. The National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA) states that “cooking is the leading cause of home fires, with nearly half (49%) of all home fires involving cooking equipment” (<https://www.nfpa.org/News-and-Research/Publications-and-media/Press-Room/News-releases/2023/NFPA-announces-Cooking-safety-starts-with-YOU-Pay-attention-to-fire-prevention-as-official-theme>). In order to keep your home safe, remember to assure that your smoke detectors have new batteries and follow these tips:

- Always keep a close eye on what you’re cooking. For foods with longer cook times, such as those that are simmering or baking, set a timer to help monitor them carefully.
- Clear the cooking area of combustible items and keep anything that can burn, such as dish towels, oven mitts, food packaging, and paper towels.
- Turn pot handles toward the back of the stove. Keep a lid nearby when cooking. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan and turn off the burner.
- Create a “kid and pet-free zone” of at least three feet (one meter) around the cooking area and anywhere else hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

### Current Crime Trends and Tips

- **Fraud:** Please monitor your banking information frequently and only use trusted sites for online purchases. Never disclose personal information to someone who calls you on the phone. Beware of callers asking for money or telling you that you won money. If it sounds suspicious or too good to be true, ask for a call back number and do some research first.
- **Theft from vehicles and vehicle thefts:** Lock your doors! Many thieves look for crimes of opportunity and if your vehicle is unlocked, that is an opportunity. Never keep any valuables in plain sight. Do not leave your money, cell phones, purse, or anything else that has value in an unattended vehicle. Park your vehicle in a lighted area. Motion lights are a great deterrent.

## 2023 REMAINING REFUSE & RECYCLING HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

#### Please be aware that Waste Management will be closed for the following holidays:

- Monday, September 4th – Labor Day
- Thursday, November 23rd – Thanksgiving Day
- Monday, December 25th – Christmas Day
- Monday, January 1st (2024) – New Years Day

During these holiday weeks, refuse (garbage) and recycling collection will be delayed by one day, following that holiday (i.e., if Waste Management is closed on a Thursday, then Thursday's pick-up will occur on Friday, and Friday's pick-up will occur on Saturday).

Waste Management is generally open the 1st Saturday of each month, from 8am – Noon, for residents who need to drop off excess recycling. Please know when a holiday falls within the first week of the month, Waste Management may adjust the weekend that they are open.

## 2023 FALL CURBSIDE YARD MATERIAL & BRUSH PICK-UP

Fall Curbside Yard Material and Brush Pickup Scheduled to begin the week of **October 16th**.

Please see the attached map and schedule identifying when pickup will occur in your neighborhood.

#### A few reminders regarding the pickup process are:

- Yard Materials (grass, leaves, pine needles, etc.) shall be kept separate from brush as two different pieces of equipment are used for these processes.
- Yard material shall be kept at least 5 feet away from power poles, mailboxes, fire hydrants, etc. in order for staff to be able to reach it.
- There will be two trips through the Village (see pick-up dates).
- Yard materials must be out to the roadside by 7AM on the scheduled day of pickup.
- Any material that is placed out after the scheduled pickup day will not be picked up.
- Residents can always take material to the Village's recycling site located at 8200 Ryan St.



## BUILDING PERMITS

All building permits in the Village are submitted online via the Evolve permitting module found at [www.westonwi.gov/epermits](http://www.westonwi.gov/epermits). Permits can be applied for 24/7 from home or with the help of staff at the Municipal Center. To help streamline the building permit process for our customers, the Village is also able to take online payments for permits using EFT or credit card. Please note, there is a small convenience fee if you choose to use this option as State law prohibits the Village from paying credit card processing fees:

- \$0.64 for Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT)/E-Check option
- 3.25% + \$1.00 for all credit and debit card transactions.

It should also be noted, the invoice received via email to the applicant is not the permit. Permits are not issued until payment is received. When submitting payment by checks, please include the invoice number contained in the email. To ensure that you are able to meet with the inspectors to discuss your project or if you need help filling out the permit application, it is recommended that you please call 715-241-2613 or email [plandev@westonwi.gov](mailto:plandev@westonwi.gov) to schedule an appointment to ensure a staff member will be available to assist you.

As of January 1, 2023, Inspection Appointments can be scheduled the following days/times:

**Monday through Thursday:**

9am to Noon and 1pm to 3:30pm

**Friday:** Emergency Inspections Only

Commercial Electrical Inspections will be scheduled Tuesday and Thursdays only unless a week's prior notice is received, and arrangements can be made with our part-time Commercial Electrical Inspector. When coming to an appointment, it is very much appreciated if you bring a summary and preliminary sketch of your project. It is helpful if this can be emailed to staff in advance of the meeting so that we are better able to answer your questions or assist you during the meeting.

The Building Inspectors Team thanks you in advance for your cooperation. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call or email them. The Team looks forward to assisting you with your projects in the future.




## CHICKENS




