## Refuse & Recycling Guide



## We are switching from Waste Management to Harter's Fox Valley Disposal, beginning January 1, 2026.

### Here's what you should expect:

Harter's Fox Valley Disposal will deliver new 95-gallon garbage and recycling carts to every single-family home and residential building (up to four units) starting in mid-December with a completion date by the end of the month. Please note: **these carts are not to be used**

**until after January 1, 2026**, when Harter's contract officially begins. The new carts will have an informational packet attached, including Harter's contact information, a collection pick-up schedule and recycling guidelines sheet. Your collection day of the week will remain the same under the new service, i.e. if your collection day is Tuesday, it will remain on Tuesday in 2026.

Residents who prefer a **smaller 65-gallon garbage cart** can request an exchange after the first two months of service. Please contact Harter's directly at (715) 446-5400 or (888) 804-8556 to request the exchange.

During the last two weeks of December, **Waste Management will collect all their garbage and recycling carts** on your regular collection day.

## Attention Snowbirds!



### If you will be away in December:

- Ask a neighbor, friend, or family member to bring your new Harter's carts up to your house once delivered.
- For Waste Management carts, you can also ask someone to place them at the curb for collection.

## Garbage and Recycling Fee

The refuse and recycling fee is billed annually and included as a line item on your property tax bill. The fee covers the cost of waste and recycling collection services, but also the curbside yard waste materials collections, bulk-item drop-off, and other specialty events, such as free electronics recycling, free paper shred day, plus the operation of the Ryan Street Yard Material Site (8200 Ryan Street). The Village has not raised the refuse and recycling fee in seven years. The decision to change collection services was completed through a Request for Proposal process. While a competitive process that ensured market-based pricing, **the annual fee will increase to \$205.50/annually**, due to rising material, labor, and operational expenses. Without the change in service providers, the fee would have needed to be increased even more.



## Services that will be provided 2026 – 2032

### At Harter's business location (169901 Ringle Ave, Ringle), during their business hours:

- Free drop off of overflow recycling
- For a **fee** drop off of overflow garbage and large bulky items

### Curbside collection options:

- Overflow garbage and recycling stickers, at \$2.00 per sticker, available for purchase at the Municipal Building, 4747 Camp Phillips Road
- Pick-up of large items (like furniture), for a fee

### January Christmas Tree collection:

Will take place the last two weeks of January, on your regular garbage collection day

### Spring & Fall Bulk-Item Drop-Off (at Harter's Ringle location):

Will take place the 3rd weekend of May and 1st weekend of October

### Damaged Cart Replacement/Repair:

Contact Harter's directly to request repair or replacement of damaged carts.

Please be aware that only RECYCLABLES are allowed in your 95-gallon recycling cart. If it is found that you have refuse (garbage) in your recycling cart, Harter's will not empty it. Similarly, if it is found that you have recyclables in your refuse cart, Harter's will not empty it.

**Please be aware that you can be fined for not properly recycling, as recycling is State Law.** If you like to read Weston's Solid Waste Ordinance, you can find it online at: [www.westonwi.gov/SolidWaste](http://www.westonwi.gov/SolidWaste).

# WHAT'S RECYCLABLE?



In 1990, Wisconsin enacted a recycling law to help landfills last longer and to encourage reduction, reuse, and recycling of Wisconsin's solid waste. This recycling law bans many materials from Wisconsin's landfills, with the intent that such materials will instead be reused, recycled, or composted. This Recycling Guidebook contains helpful information relating to your refuse and recycling needs both in the Village and Town of Weston.

## ✓ Acceptable Items



### Plastics

Recycle plastics #1, #2 and #5. Look on the bottom of containers for the number inside the recycling arrows.  
\*Black plastic food containers/trays are not allowed, however\*



### Metal Cans

Recycle all food and beverage metal cans—steel, tin, bi-metal and aluminum.



### Cardboard, Newspaper & Magazines

Recycle newspaper inserts, catalogs, paperback books, phone books and brochures.



### Paper Food Containers & Cartons

Recycle juice boxes, egg, ice cream and milk cartons, and cereal and pasta boxes.



### Paper

Recycle envelopes, office paper, junk mail, greeting cards and file folders. Shredded paper should be put in a paper bag.



### Glass

Recycle clear, brown and green bottles and jars.



Empty. Clean. Dry.

Please make sure your recyclables are **empty, clean and dry** before placing them in your recycling cart.

# Plastics 101

Plastics can be so confusing, as far as knowing how to properly dispose of them. A product made of plastic is often stamped with a resin code, which is a number between one and seven inside a small triangle made of arrows. The presence of a resin code doesn't necessarily mean that the product can be recycled. It's the number inside the triangle that counts, because each number corresponds to a different type of plastic.



## 1: PET or PETE (Polyethylene terephthalate)

PET or PETE is what's used to make bottles for soda, water and other drinks. It's also used to make cooking oil containers, plastic peanut butter jars and containers for other popular food items. These plastics can go within your recycling cart (this now includes those clear berry-type containers).

## 2: HDPE (High density polyethylene)

HDPE plastics are those used to make milk jugs, shampoo bottles, cleaning product containers and detergent bottles. These plastics can go within your recycling cart.

## 3: PVC (Polyvinyl chloride)

PVC is a soft, flexible plastic, so it's used for a huge array of household products. Plastic tubing, kids' toys, plastic trays and furniture are often made out of PVC. PVC cannot be recycled, and should not go within your recycling cart.

## 4: LDPE (Low density polyethylene)

A lot of plastic wrappings are made of LDPE plastic. It's also used to make grocery bags and the bags that hold newspapers, sliced bread loaves and fresh produce, among other things. LDPE plastics (plastic bags/film) should be taken to places like your local grocery store for proper recycling.

## 5: PP (Polypropylene)

PP is used to make the food containers used for products like yogurt, sour cream and margarine. It's also made into straws, rope, carpet and bottle caps. These plastics can go within your recycling cart (with the exception of those black food containers/trays).

## 6: PS (Polystyrene)

Styrofoam products are made out of PS plastic, so it's commonly used to make disposable coffee cups, packing peanuts, coolers and to-go food containers. Formed Styrofoam can be dropped off at Styrene Products for proper recycling (with the exception of the packing peanuts).

## 7: Other

Any type of plastic that doesn't fit into one of the first six categories falls under this heading. Products stamped with a 7 are often made out of multiple plastic types or out of other types of plastic that can't easily be recycled. These should be disposed of in your trash.



- *In Weston, you can recycle plastics #1, #2, and #5 in your recycling carts, with the exception of #5 black plastic food containers & trays.*

## CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION

Harter's will be collecting properly set out Christmas Trees in January.

▲ Harter's will be collecting properly set out Christmas Trees the last two weeks in January, on your regular garbage pick-up day.

▲ In order to have your tree picked up, it needs to be cut in half, and no longer than 4 feet in length. Trees need to be set out by 6:00am, or the night before, the day of collection.

▲ If your tree did not get picked up on your garbage collection day, during the last two weeks in January, please contact Harter's, at (715) 446-5400, or email [arfoxvalley@harters.net](mailto:arfoxvalley@harters.net), right away.

▲ If you do not want to wait to have your tree collected, you can deliver it to Marathon County Solid Waste Department (a.k.a. Ringle Landfill), 172900 State Highway 29, Ringle. However, they do charge a small fee.

## WHAT TO DO WITH BURNT OUT HOLIDAY LIGHTS?

Please **DO NOT** place holiday lights into your recycling cart!

## HOSTING A SPECIAL EVENT? DON'T FORGET ABOUT RECYCLING!

If you are hosting a special event, whether it be a large public event or private event, don't forget to recycling. Everyone has trash containers that gets set out; but what about recycling containers? How do you make it obvious to your guests which container is which?

Marathon County Solid Waste Department offers Clear Stream Recycling Containers – FREE for event hosts to borrow!

Along with the container (as pictured), you'll be provided with clear bags to use at your event. All you have to do is call Marathon County Solid Waste Department at 715-344-8198, in advance of your event to reserve your containers and drop them back off when finished. It's THAT easy. So be sure to recycle at your next event!



## WHAT DO I GET FOR MY REFUSE/RECYCLING FEE?

Property owners of single-family homes up to 4-unit apartments (on 1 tax parcel) are billed an annual refuse/recycling special charge on their property tax bill. In 2026, the annual fee will be calculated at \$205.50 per residential unit.

For those properties who are charged this amount, this special charge covers the costs of several benefits available to you:

- Weekly curbside refuse (garbage) collection and every-other week single-stream recycling collection.
- Weekly curbside refuse and recycling overflow collection (just \$2.00 for an overflow sticker).
- Weekly curbside large item (like furniture) collection for a private **fee charged by Harter's**.
- Post-holiday curbside Christmas tree collection.
- Spring & fall curbside yard waste collection.
- Year-round (24/7) yard waste drop off availability at the Weston Yard Waste Site (8200 Ryan St).
- Spring & fall bulk-item drop-off events at Harter's Fox Valley Disposal (169901 Ringle Ave, Ringle).
- Free recycling drop-off center, at Harter's (Monday-Friday, 7am-4:30pm)
- For a fee excess garbage and large item drop, at Harter's (Monday-Friday, 7am-4:30pm)
- Spring and fall **free** Community Paper Shred Day events
- Spring and fall **free** Electronics Recycling events

# What to do with... THE FOLLOWING ITEMS



## USED MOTOR OIL & FILTERS

Used motor oil and filters can be taken to places like O'Reilly Auto Parts, along with other general automotive fluids (such as transmission and steering fluids). However, it is best to contact these businesses to verify. You can also take used motor oil to Marathon County Solid Waste Department's Household Hazardous Waste building for free disposal.



## HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES



Household / Alkaline Batteries (AAA, AA, C, D, 6V, 9V) are not hazardous and can be placed in the regular garbage; however, if you prefer to keep these out of the landfill, consider delivering them to places that accept batteries for recycling.

Batteries Plus has teamed up with the Green Bay Packers to promote battery recycling awareness and education to Packers fans about the importance of recycling batteries in order to security America's supply of critical minerals.

Batteries Plus will accept most batteries free of charge; however, at the store, they will ask that you set up a basic account within their system by providing your name, email, and phone number for promotional purposes.

Marathon County Solid Waste Department will accept all batteries for safe and proper recycling, as well. However, they do charge a small per pound fee.

## LEAD-ACID BATTERIES



Lead-acid batteries can be taken to Northern Battery, 3607 Schofield Avenue, where they will

accept those for free (and may even give you a couple of bucks for them). Batteries Plus in Rib Mountain, will accept them as well. Another option is to take them out to Marathon County Solid Waste Department (a.k.a. Ringle Landfill); however, they do charge \$2.00/pound for those.

## SCRAP METAL

If you have scrap metal items to dispose of, Yaeger Auto Salvage, 8205 Camp Phillips Road, will accept it year-round for free (and may even give you some money for it). Please refer to the Yaeger Auto Salvage insert on page 16, for more information, or call 715-359-3606.

## FLUORESCENT LIGHT BULBS

Because Compact Fluorescent Lamp (CFL) light bulbs contain mercury, they are considered hazardous waste. A few places that accept CFL bulbs, but charge a small fee, are Marathon County Solid Waste Department and Batteries Plus in Rib Mountain.



## USED COOKING OIL

Marathon County Solid Waste Department, 172900 State Highway 29, Ringle, will accept used cooking oil for recycling. There are also many restaurants that will accept used cooking oil, for recycling. If you need to dispose of the cooking oil in your trash, consider adding kitty litter or some type of oil absorbent prior to tossing it into your cart.



## SMALL KITCHEN APPLIANCES

With single-stream recycling, where plastics and certain metals are placed within the same cart, some people have asked if they can recycle their small kitchen appliances in their recycling cart. The answer is NO. The reason for this is when the recyclables are delivered to the MRF (Material Recovery Facility), all materials are separated, at a very high rate of speed, by sorters (human, mechanical, and electronically). The sorters would have to physically take these appliances apart in order to separate them, which is not practical or feasible. For this reason, small kitchen appliances can be taken to Yaeger Auto Salvage for recycling for free. Another option is to hold on to it until the Village holds its FREE spring and fall electronics recycling events (more information on page 11).

## OUTDATED/UNWANTED PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION

**Mountain Bay Metro Police Department (211 Grand Avenue, Rothschild) has a secure drop box in their lobby, where you can drop off your unwanted/outdated prescription medication**

—no questions asked. Combine all medication into one ziplock bag and simply drop the packaged medication into the drop box. **Please note that needles and chemotherapy drugs are NOT accepted in this drop box.**



## SHARPS

Marathon County Solid Waste Department, 172900 State Highway 29, Ringle, will accept used sharps free of charge, at their hazardous waste facility, provided they are placed within a commercial sharps container (which can be found at most pharmacies) or placed in a heavy plastic detergent or bleach bottle with a screw-on cap. Do NOT use milk jugs or other thin plastic containers! You can also find a list of registered sharps collection locations by visiting the following Wisconsin DNR Website: <https://dnr.wisconsin.gov/topic/HealthWaste/CollectSharps.html>.



## AEROSOL CANS

Aerosol cans (even if empty) are NOT to go into the recycling cart.

If the container is completely empty, where all the propellant is out of it, you can you can toss it into the trash. If the container is not 100% empty (whether hazardous or not), it is best to take it to Marathon County Hazardous Waste Site, where they will accept it for free. Aerosol cans with propellant still in it should not be placed in landfills due to their potential for explosion and hazardous waste properties.



## PLASTIC BAGS

Plastic bags should NOT be placed in your recycling cart. Not only do they get loose and blow around in the community, but they also get tangled up in the equipment used to manage recyclables. Please consider recycling your plastic bags by taking them to Weston Pick'n Save, Target, or Festival Foods; as they have recycling bins at the front of their stores specifically for collecting plastic bags. Or, consider donating them to places like Goodwill, the Humane Society, or childcare facilities.



## STYROFOAM

Styrofoam is the second most misplaced item we find in the recycling carts.

The large white pieces of Styrofoam can be recycled, but not in our recycling carts. We recommend you take these to Styrene Products (see add on page 15). Styrene Products only accepts certain foam products during their office hours, Monday-Thursday, 6am-2pm.

Please know that the small pieces (like packaging peanuts and food containers) are not recyclable and should be sealed up in a plastic bag and thrown in the trash (unless you can reuse those for your own packaging needs).



## KEEPING PAPER & CARDBOARD OUT OF THE TRASH!

If you have **cardboard** that you need to dispose of, as long as it is clean and dry, simply flatten it and place it in your recycling cart.

Keep in mind that too much cardboard in the recycling cart can create a “jam” in the cart, where when the recycling truck driver comes to empty your cart, the contents will remain stuck in your recycling cart.

Another option to dispose of your cardboard, if you are an eligible resident, is to (still flatten and) take it directly to Harter’s Fox Valley Disposal’s site, 169901 Ringle Avenue, Ringle, for free disposal. You will need to go there during their office hours and check in at the office there. You will be required to show your eligible address, and then they will direct you to where to go to drop off your cardboard.

As far as paper goes, a lot of people are afraid of their confidential information being seen and/or shared if placed in the recycling cart. Please know, general recycling of paper is very safe. When the paper reaches the recycling sorting facilities (called MRF – Material Recovery Facility), the paper is moved extremely quickly through the conveyors and different machinery/computers and the staff that assists with sorting materials along the line would have no way of reading what is on there. The only way it becomes “unsafe” is when:


*\*blows out of the recycling dumpster (if the lid blows open on a windy day)*

*\*if the driver of the recycling truck forgets to close the top door on the truck after dumping the recyclables within (then when driving down the road, papers can potentially blow out)*


If you have confidential paper that you do not feel comfortable throwing in the recycling cart, and if you are able to hold on to it, the Village will be holding its FREE spring and fall paper shred day events, where you can drop it off (more information on page 11).

If you feel it necessary to shred your paper, please know that **shredded paper is NOT allowed in your recycling cart**. When shredded paper reaches the MRF, it essentially acts like confetti by exploding and landing all over the place, and falling into other recycling material lines, potentially contaminating those lines.

If you have shredded paper, you can either see if a local farmer will take it for bedding, if you have a garden, you can use it in your compost, or last resort, simply throw your shredded paper in the trash.

## 2026 CLEAN-UP EVENTS

### YARD MATERIALS PICK-UP SPRING & FALL

The Spring Yard Materials Pick-Up generally occurs beginning the second week of May, and the Fall Yard Materials Pick-Up generally occurs beginning the second week of October.

Please watch our website or contact the Village of Weston office closer to that time period for updates. Yard materials can be taken directly to the Weston Yard Materials Site (8200 Ryan Street), where you can dispose of your yard materials at a time that is convenient to you. Please be aware that only Weston residents who pay the special Refuse & Recycling charge on their property tax bill are eligible to use the Weston Yard Materials Site.

If you're at the Yard Materials Site and witness someone throwing garbage in the yard waste site dumpsters or leaving garbage on the ground, please take note of their vehicle and license plate number and contact Mountain Bay Metro Police Department (715-359-3333).

Another option for yard materials disposal is to contract Hsu Growing Supply. See pg. 12 for more information.



### ELECTRONICS RECYCLING EVENTS SPRING & FALL

The Village of Weston will again be offering spring and fall electronics recycling events in 2026: **May 23 and October 10**. This will also be held behind the Weston Municipal Center, during the hours of Noon – 5pm.

In 2026, Village of Weston will be working with Dynamic Lifecycle Innovations, out of Onalaska, WI, to hold this **FREE** electronics recycling event.

Dynamic is working with many local municipalities to hold FREE community electronics recycling events. They are able to offer free events because they are contracted with some of the WI manufacturers who are taking in the separated electronics parts/materials for the manufacturing of brand new electronics. As part of the E-Cycle Wisconsin program, the WI manufacturers have a State-mandated requirement to meet certain recycling obligations, and Dynamic helps them with this.

### COMMUNITY PAPER SHREDDING EVENTS SPRING & FALL

The Village of Weston is working again with IROW to host spring & fall community paper shredding events.

In 2026, the events will be held on **May 20 and October 7**. Both will be behind the Weston Municipal Center, during the hours of 3:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. This event is open to the general public.

IROW staff will be here to collect your unwanted papers, which will be immediately placed into their secure trucks, where following each event, will be hauled directly to their licensed facility for destruction.

## HOME COMPOSTING

Composting (“recycling”) your yard, garden, and kitchen waste is the easiest and cheapest way of taking responsibility for some of your own waste. Did you know that food and yard waste make up 25 – 30% of our solid waste nationwide?

The BEST place to compost is in our own backyards! Composting meets the criteria of the three Rs: reduce, reuse, and recycle. Through composting, the amount of waste sent to the landfill is reduced, the organic matter is reused, and it is recycled into a useful soil additive.

If you’re interested in learning more about home composting and/or would like to purchase a compost bin, please contact Marathon County Solid Waste at 715-344-8198. # Recycling Cart REMINDERS

## CART PLACEMENT

Please place your recycling cart on the opposite side of your driveway as your refuse (garbage) cart on pick-up day. If this is not possible, **please keep at least 4 feet of space in between the two carts** to allow enough room for the mechanical hand on Harter's truck to reach around the cart so it can be picked up and emptied without disturbing your other cart. **Please do NOT place carts in the roadway, as they will create a hazard to traffic and will be at risk of getting struck by a snowplow.** The Village of Weston will not be responsible for refuse and recycling carts damaged due to being struck by snowplows.

## RECOMMENDED CART PLACEMENT



- Place carts on either side of the driveway (pictured here) or on the same side with at least 4 feet between carts.
- To prevent accidental mailbox damage, keep 4 feet between the cart and your mailbox.

While we understand that you may face some challenges with the placement of your carts during the winter months, we ask that you consider the following ideas:

- Only place your refuse cart out on non-recycling weeks.
- Shovel an area of your snowbank to allow one (or both) of your carts to be located on the boulevard.

## DID YOU KNOW...

You can bring clothing, like old, tattered, non-salable t-shirts, to Goodwill, where those shirts will be sent to their facility in Appleton and processed into rags? Next time you have a torn shirt and are thinking of throwing it in the trash, consider taking it to Goodwill!

Marathon County Solid Waste Department (a.k.a. Ringle Landfill), located at 172900 State Highway 29, in Ringle, is a great resource for people to consider if they have large amounts of trash or large bulky items to dispose of. The cost to dispose of material is very reasonable.

Also, if you have excess recyclables to dispose of, you can bring those there (for a small fee).



## IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- To be guaranteed pick-up of your refuse and recycling, you must have your carts placed out at the edge of your property by 6:00 a.m., the morning of your collection day.
- Refuse and recycling carts are to be removed from the right-of-way (curbside/boulevard area) within 12 hours of collection time.
- To prevent carts from being an obstruction to snowplows, carts are prohibited from being placed within the roadway. The Village will NOT be responsible for carts that are damaged due to being struck by Village snowplows.
- Carts should not be overfilled. Overfilled carts can lead to your garbage and/or recyclables blowing out on windy days, or can lead to spills when the Harter's driver is trying to empty it. The Harter's driver has the authority to choose not to empty a cart that is overflowing. Excess garbage and recycling stickers can be purchased at the Weston Municipal Center for \$2.00.
- All garbage within the garbage cart should be bagged.
- All recyclables within the recycling cart should be placed loosely in the cart (no bags).
