How would you characterize your attitude towards biking?




Overall, how satisfied are you with Weston's sidewalk, trail, and bike route network?

How often do you walk or bike for the following reasons?




What types of trails do you like?

The mapping tool had 456 visits to the site and 304 comments

Ideas for future improvements

- Extend and connect trails, especially Mountain Bay State Trail and Ross Ave/Camp Phillips gaps.
- Add more crossings and access points for Hwy 29, the Eau Claire River, and near schools.
- Add bike racks, trailhead amenities, and traffic calming to support everyday use.

What people like/destinations

- Eau Claire River Trail and Mountain Bay State Trail are highly valued for being scenic and quiet.
- People love connections to parks, river access, trailheads, and Schofield Ave businesses.
- Ross Ave bike lanes and trail crossings are popular and important.

Concerns over existing conditions

- Many streets lack sidewalks or bike lanes (Co Rd J, Ryan St, Sandy Lane, Alderson St).
- Crossings are difficult, especially on Schofield Ave, Ross Ave, Camp Phillips, and Hwy 29.
- High traffic speeds (Ross Ave, Riverbend) reduce comfort and safety.
